
KENDALL ELEMENTARY GIFTED & TALENTED: GROWTH MINDSET

- 1. HELP STUDENTS RECOGNIZE THEIR STRENGTHS AND THEIR WEAKNESSES. SHOW THEM HOW TO USE THEIR STRENGTHS TO DEVELOP THEIR WEAK AREAS OR FIND LEARNING.
- 2. PROVIDE DESCRIPTIVE, ACCURATE, AND CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK THAT FOCUSES ON HOW STUDENTS CAN DEVELOP THEMSELVES IN SPECIFIC TASKS OR SKILL AREAS.
- 3. FOCUS PRAISE ON THE EFFORT STUDENTS PUT FORTH TOWARD A GOAL.
- OFFER AUTHENTIC CHALLENGES ON ISSUES THEY OR OTHERS CARE ABOUT THAT WILL TAKE TIME, EFFORT, AND PERSISTENCE TO SOLVE.
- 5. STRUCTURE TIME THROUGHOUT THE DAY WHEN STUDENTS CAN REFLECT ON THEIR LEARNING PROCESS.
- 6. CREATE LEARNING ACTIVITIES WHERE STUDENTS WILL NEED TO RELY ON OTHERS TO COMPLETE THE TASKS. IN THESE "UNLIKE" GROUPS, STUDENTS LEARN TO APPRECIATE OTHER PEOPLE'S SKILLS AND REALIZE THEY HAVE SKILLS UNIQUE TO THEMSELVES.
- CONTINUALLY SUPPORT STUDENTS BY SHOWING THEM HOW THEIR 7. EFFORTS LEAD TO SUCCESS.

Growth Mindset

Strengthen your mind by believing you can improve your abilities

Why does growth mindset matter Having a growth mindset helps you focus on developing your abilities rather than proving how smart or talented you are.

A growth mindset encourages you to embrace challenges, sustain effort, and try new strategies—and that's true for both children and adults.

Shown evidence that the brain is like a muscle—something you can strengthen—students adopt more of a growth mindset about intelligence and earn higher grades.



How do I encourage a growth mindset?

Model it: Share stories of when you fell short of your expectations but nevertheless learned an important lesson.

Celebrate it: Praise the process of learning.

Enable it: Create authentic opportunities for learning. Give students meaningful challenges, consistent support, and timely, constructive feedback.

Growth Mindset Pulse Check for Spring

Think about yourself. How many of these things are true?

- After I make a mistake, I always look for ways to learn from it.
- I love challenges because they make me smarter.
- I truly believe that people can change.
- I can always change how intelligent I am.
- I can ask a teacher for support. He or she may say "Let's set a stretch goal together—what's something you want to accomplish but can't do yet? What can I do to help?"
